Limited humans, an unlimited God

Restrictions. Guidelines. Face masks. Social distancing. The limiting of our day-to-day freedom in order to stop the spread of a highly contagious virus has brought into focus a fact which has been true since the beginning of time: humans are limited. We have always lived with restrictions – hunger, thirst, tiredness, illness, finite mental capacity, to name but a few. But being part of a western, relatively prosperous, and largely free society has often lulled us into an over-inflated view of our own capabilities. Even in our Christian ministry we easily forget our human limitations and inadvertently begin to believe that we are responsible for saving the world.

Moses made this mistake: talented, wealthy and educated, he embarked on his own plan to save his people, and failed miserably. By the time he was 80 he had no resources of his own, he was a poor shepherd in a foreign land, with no ambitions to be the saviour of the Israelites. That's when God speaks to him from a bush and reminds him, "I AM that I AM" and "I will be with you". He is the transcendent God, unlimited in His capabilities, and He is asking Moses to be part of His plan, not to come up with His own. and highlighted our limitations, but that will not be a bad thing if it leads us to rely more fully on our unrestricted God, and to ask Him to allow us the privilege of being part of **His** plan.

THE WAY FORWARD

At BCM NI we have watched with thanksgiving and amazement as God has made the path ahead clear, little by little, over the past 6 months. We have been hugely encouraged by Virtual Camp and Hello Life, and enjoyed meeting with our fellow workers from across the UK and Ireland

Bubbles discipleship groups have been working hard to keep in touch with their young people and are hoping to meet face-toface as often as possible this autumn. The City Teens team met with groups of their campers at the start of September, providing opportunities to share from the Bible, and to strengthen relationships with the young people, some of whom are now in their 20s. Our Bible Club leaders are currently considering how they can connect with their children in coming months, and a new club, following on from Hello Life Belfast, is underway in West Belfast.




Missionary Updates
