# **Updating Mullartown**

Hard to believe the last weekend group we had here at Mullartown was 15 March 2020. Very strange having no campers running about, late night glow stick hunts, groups arriving full of energy for a mighty weekend and leaving tired and exhausted but with a smile on their face of great memories.

We are very glad we have received peace over the closure during the pandemic.

We have been trying not to get discouraged at not being able to open and not having interns or people generally about Mullartown. We find ourselves constantly needing to turn to God for hope and reassurance.

In Philippians 1:6 it tells us "I am sure of this, that he who began a good work in you will bring it to completion at the day of Jesus Christ." We have been called to a minstry at Mullartown House and have been encouraged to look at different ways to minister to kids and young people.

We felt led to open *Mullartown Live* up during half term for a 5 day club looking at the invitation Jesus calls us to, and then again for a 'Christmas Mullartown Special' looking at Jesus coming to be the Light of the World. We received over 800 views for these two sets of *Mullartown Live* which is amazing. A lot of our summer volunteers were involved for which we are very thankful. Since October we have had **Bubbles** and **Oaks** meet in person during the times when restrictions allowed them to, which the young people have just loved.

During this time of closure we have been using the time wisely to do much needed **maintenance work**. This has included repainting the walls, roof and skirting in Meelbeg, Meelmore and Ben Crom (three of the most used dorms at camp which can't be closed off during weekends). We are also repainting the metal bunks in these dorms and planning to replace the carpets too.

**Storage** has always been an issue and one of those jobs we constantly have on the list and never get round to - so we have been able to put shelves in the sports hall sports cupboard, in peak (under the barn) and in the attic.

The major project we have taken on is the refurb of the **kitchen** - this has included removal of the units and the ceiling and we have now put in a new wooden ceiling with recessed lights. A new window

is going to be installed, new fitted kitchen units, including an island, new electrics and splashbacks are on the list too so hopefully by end of February it will be completed. We are very pleased to say we have received the full finances required to complete the kitchen project and want to thank everyone who contributed to that: God is good.

Ongoing **outdoor jobs** are being worked on as well, in order keep the grounds looking well.

So all in all we are continually thankful for God's provision of safety, supplies just when we need them, and a real peace through this time.

#### The WAY (Wallace Avenue Youth)
