Every camp had the chance to have at least one day at Mullartown, which was a huge step up from last summer's fully virtual camps. Our bible lessons looked at the life of Joseph and how he was rejected, sold, put into prison, became a prime minister of Egypt - saving a nation and finally forgiving his family. We also learned how Joseph made us think about Jesus and what Jesus did for each one of us.

In Junior and Senior Teens they were looking at ANTICIPATE - sharing with the campers what they are to expect in a life following Jesus from the story of Joseph.

On the reverse of all our camp T-Shirts we had the verse from Romans 8:28 "And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love Him, who have been called according to His purpose" – a daily reminder that God had a plan and a purpose, even when there were multiple challenges.

We are SO thankful for all the opportunities to share the Word of God with children and teenagers (and adults!) via the summer camp ministry – COVID has taught us not to take those privileges for granted and we can't wait to return to a normal COVID FREE summer.
