

ENDURE BIBLE STUDY NATHANAEL MCILVEEN



This year at **Endure**, we've been focused on the book of Galatians and Paul's defence of the Gospel against the Judaizers. The emphasis on salvation by faith alone and not by the law has really encouraged us all to rely solely on Jesus. Our Endure group has also provided amazing fellowship and a fantastic opportunity to cultivate Christian friendships to support and build each other up in our faith. We've been encouraged to intentionally pray for and with each other, not only at our weekly meeting but also during the week.



The theme for the **Junior Teens' Weekend** was '*Upside Down Living*', a challenging look at the Beatitudes in Matthew 5 and their counter-cultural call to a radical re-ordering of our lives. Nearly 60 junior teens gathered over the first weekend of December to consider the blessings of living for Jesus, to be encouraged to dig into God's word on their own, and (of course) to get up to all sorts of fun. Despite the rather freezing weather, the group enjoyed worship, good teaching, great food, and even breakfast at the beach (which involved a lot of hot chocolate and tea!).

Deeper: Over the first few meetings of the school term we have been overjoyed to have over 50 young people come out to Sloan Street Presbyterian for our first-Saturday-of-the-month fellowship and Bible study night. Offered as a follow-up to Junior Teens, and open to years 9-12, we spend time hanging out (with plenty of snacks), playing games, singing, studying God's Word, and in small groups. This year, Deeper is working through Jesus' Sermon on the Mount in Matthew 5-7, considering what living as part of the kingdom of God looks like. It's been a blessing to be able to maintain and deepen relationships with so many of the summer campers, and to see young people deepen their knowledge of and love for the Lord.

THE TRUTH WILL SET YOU FREE

Many of the children with whom we work in Belfast come from homes where the truth of God's word is largely unknown. Instead, the children are bombarded with lies, which lead to an absence of hope. What a privilege to have over 40 of them at Mullartown in October for a City Kids' Camp. Over the weekend our theme was '*Truth versus lies*': in hobbies the children learnt magic tricks and created "lying cupcakes"; and on Saturday evening they helped Inspector Cluedo discover the truth about a heinous crime! But the most important aspects of the weekend were our barn times and quiet times where we focused on 4 key truths from the Bible, truths contrary to commonly-held beliefs. We pray that the Holy Spirit will dispel the lies which they hear regularly, and lead the children to saving faith in Christ.

A large number of the children we meet at Bible Clubs have never been to camp, and may never be able to attend. Visiting the Divis Bible Club a few times gave us the opportunity to pour more truth into the hearts of children we met during Hello Life 2022, and we also had an encouraging spell in the **Markets** area of Belfast. In spite of the dark and cold, the children came rushing over at 6pm each Thursday, many of them coming all five weeks, and we taught them about people in the Bible who had meals with Jesus. The truth of God's Word is beginning to sink into some of the children's hearts and minds – please pray with us that they will find freedom in Jesus Christ.
