What a term we have had at Bible Club! This year we knocked on every door in Stoneyford to give a personal invitation. 22 children arrived on our first night, and each week we have had new children come along. In total 40 children have attended since October, averaging 18-22 children each Friday, all very keen to learn from God's Word.

Our first few lessons focused on how we got the Bible, why it is such a special book, and about William Tyndale translating the Bible from Hebrew and Greek into English. An 'Open Bible Night' involved splitting up into a



few groups, looking up verses and discussing different aspects of the Bible. We were able to gift a Bible to some children who did not have one. Their joy was evident as they left that night running to show their parents their new Bible. Our next series on Daniel was very well received by the children as they learnt about how God was with Daniel and his friends in Babylon. These lessons gave a great opportunity for the Gospel to be explained to the children each week.

For the first time we invited the parents to come along to the Christmas party to hear the children sing and share what they had been learning. It was a great night and we were able to share the real meaning of Christmas. Thank you for your continued prayers and support for Stoneyford Bible Club. Praise God with us for His faithfulness and the encouragement we have received this year.

## THE BCM CENTRE - LISBURN




