

# Ministry Development Worker

## Job Description



**Mission Statement:** BCM International is a global Bible-Centred Ministry dedicated to making disciples of all ages for the Lord Jesus Christ through evangelism, teaching and training, so that churches are established and the Church strengthened.

**Summary of the Role:** BCM NI is planning to appoint either one full-time Ministry Development worker, or 2-3 part-time Ministry Development workers. The Ministry Development worker(s) will be responsible for maintaining and developing BCM NI's ministry among children and young people, particularly in Lurgan, Downpatrick or Lisburn. They will ensure that this is carried out in a manner which furthers the vision, mission and charitable objects of BCM NI, and which is consistent with the doctrinal beliefs and core values of the organisation.

### ***Key roles and responsibilities***

1. Support Hello Life Bible Clubs.
2. Support term-time Bible Clubs.
3. Seek to develop further connections with communities and churches in Hello Life locations in order to develop consistent term-time ministry with children in these areas.
4. Develop consistent term-time Bible Clubs and schools' ministry in Hello Life locations, particularly Downpatrick, Lurgan or Lisburn.
5. Recruit volunteers to help with Bible Clubs and Hello Life teams.
6. Survey ministry gaps in Hello Life locations, especially Lurgan and Lisburn.
7. Re-develop children's ministry in the BCM Centre in Lisburn.

8. Plant new Bible Clubs in other parts of Northern Ireland, focusing on areas which are less exposed to the Gospel.
9. Organise and develop Bible Club resources.
