This is the frontline of summer ministry - creating a safe, fun, joyful atmosphere at camps and Bible Clubs so that children's hearts are ready to hear about the Saviour who loves them, and who is inviting them to trust Him. Now, as we look back over Summer 2025, we celebrate with joy every opportunity given to our 300+ volunteers to share Jesus with children and young people.

But we also celebrate the huge amount of background work carried out in order to make these opportunities possible: the months of admin, the hours of cleaning and tidying, the daily dishwashing and cooking done by each week's kitchen team, the weeks of planning by Programme Directors and Team Leaders - not

to mention the hours of faithful prayer by supporters - some we know and some we don't.
